After almost a year in the formulation of terms of reference etc., the Heritage Council invites members of the public involved in genealogical research privately or commercially to contribute their views on the use of genealogical records, heraldic records and other genealogical resources within the State. These views will form part of a research study currently being carried out by the Heritage Council. Indeed, it was Dun Laoghaire Genealogical Society that requested such of the previous Minister, Michael D. Higgins T.D. and in response, he set up this study. All submissions should indicate whether they are made by individuals or on behalf of an organisation. Organisations are requested to submit details of members and a copy of their constitution. Though, this Society will be making a comprehensive submission on its own behalf, and no doubt, contributing to that of C.I.G.O., we urge all our members to take this valuable and rare opportunity to have their views known on this subject. We have a chance here to improve accessibility to our genealogical heritage and to record our views on the Comptroller & Auditor General's recent Value for Money Report on the Irish Genealogical Project. All submissions should be forwarded to GENEALOGY STUDY. The Heritage Council, Kilkenny City, Co. Kilkenny and the closing date for submissions is: FRI. NOV. 7th. 1997 . However, the Heritage Council has set out six principle areas for consideration i.e. Structure; Services; Access; Preservation; Guardianship and Development. Submissions should address these areas. It remains to be seen if this study will herald changes or simply gather dust, we'll see!

QUERY FROM AN OVERSEAS MEMBER Brigid McCrory, b. 19. January 1894 in Mountjoy Village, Co. Tyrone, daughter of Thomas McCrory & Brigid McCrory, formerly Taggart; sister of Elizabeth b. 1891, Eugene (Owen) b. 1895, Anna b. 1898 and James, b. 1900 (in Scotland). Brigid McCrory, later Mother M. Angeline Teresa, was the Foundress of the Order of Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm - New York, September 3. 1929. The Order has houses around the world and in Ireland at Our Lady's Manor, Dalkey, Co. Dublin. In 1900 the family moved to Carfin and later to Mossend in Scotland where her father Thomas McCrory died on January 20th 1911.
