RESOLUTIONS PASSED AT THE AGM

The following resolutions were passed at the AGM in October by an overwhelming majority of the members present. Copies of the resolutions have been forward to Brian Cowen, T.D., Minister for Health, who is responsible for the GRO, Dublin. Members, at home and overseas, are encouraged to contact either their local Teachtai Dala or directly to the Minister to obtain support for these important resolutions. Charges at the General Register Office, Dublin

That, this meeting deplores any proposed increases in the fees charged to family and historical researchers in the General Register Office and instructs the incoming Executive Committee to write accordingly to the appropriate Government Minister(s) and to such members of An Dail and An Seanad who might be sympathetic to the views of the Society

The Records of the General Register Office.

That, this meeting instructs the incoming Executive Committee to write to the appropriate Government Minister(s) and to such members of An Dail and An Seanad who might be sympathetic to the views of the Society requesting that microfilm copies of all Births, Marriages and Death Registers, now held in the General Register Office, be placed in the National Archives and National Library for free access by family and historical researchers.

C.I.G.O. and the General Register Office.

That, this meeting instructs the incoming Executive Committee to immediately request the Council of Irish Genealogical Organisations, C.I.G.O., to issue a strong protest - both publicly and directly to the appropriate Minister(s) - regarding the proposed increase in fees in the General Register Office.

Principle of Public Ownership & Right of Access.

That, this meeting fully endorses the definition of our genealogical heritage as meaning "records of birth, baptism, marriage and death: burial records; census returns; testamentary. property and school records and maps; biographies and family histories; heraldic clan/sept devices; and local histories: gravestones and the inscriptions thereon and all other associated records", and in doing so, affirms the principle of public ownership and right of access to this heritage by the people of Ireland and her diaspora. In addition, the meeting instructs the incoming Executive Committee to ensure that the Society shall only affiliate with such organisations and bodies endorsing this "Principle of Public Ownership & Right of Access.

NEW PUBLICATION

The third in the series Irish Genealogical Sources "Newcastle, County Wicklow - School Register 1864-1947" (ISBN 1 898471 70 3) price IRP5.00 (postage IRP1.00 - Ireland & IRP2.00 overseas). George H. O'Reilly has compiled and edited this valuable genealogical source as a census substitute for this area of north County Wicklow. Hopefully, other school registers will be produced in this format for ease of access for researchers in Ireland and overseas.

HERITAGE COUNCIL STUDY

The Society submitted a fully researched report to the Heritage Council as part of their study in to genealogy and genealogical practices in Ireland. A total of thirty-four paragraphs covering six sections clearly represents this Society's commitment to the development of genealogy in Ireland.
