With orders flowing in from all corners of the globe for the Society publications, and with another ten or so titles in the pipe line, the Society's publishing activities are increasingly seen as a real source of revenue to be developed over the next few years. Both the Deansgrange Memorials and the Irish Genealogical Sources Series are attracting sales in excess of expectation over the past nine months according to an audit conducted by the Society's Auditor. O'Reilly in the production of these publications, Barry's contribution to the very successful sales and distribution of the Society's publications has certainly been reflected in the latest figures from the Acting Hon. Treasurer. The Hon. Secretary is dealing with around twenty requests each week for information on the Society's publications. These requests are from individuals and societies from all over the world. In Ireland, the Genealogy Bookshop, 3, Nassau Street, Dublin, has proven to be a very successful outlet for the Society's Quarterly Journal, Deansgrange Memorials (3 vols.) and the Irish Genealogical Sources Series (6 titles) and others. The authors/compilers of these publications including Sean Magee, Brian Smith, George O'Reilly, James O. Coyle, Marie Keogh, Frieda Carroll and Barry's team of fieldworkers and typists must be congratulated for their great contribution to Irish genealogy and we look forward to new titles from Eithne Guilfoyle, Frieda Carroll, Mary Barrington and Sean Magee before the end of the year. Also, in production are Deansgrange Vol. 4 and the Memorials of the Jewish Cemetery, Dolphins Barn, Dublin. The publication of genealogical and biographical material is possibly one of the most important functions of any family history society. The Executive Committee views the Society's role in this regard as essentially "national" and therefore, it will continue to seek out and publish genealogical information from counties outside Dublin and, where available, from the Irish Diaspora throughout the world.

1848 RISING REMEMBERED Congratulations to the Slieveardagh Rural Development Group, Ballingarry, Co. Tipperary, on the announcement by An Taoiseach, Bertie Ahern, TD, that the State is to purchase the Widow McCormack's House in Ballingarry, Co. Tipperary, the scene of the Young Ireland Rising of 1848 led by William Smith O'Brien and Thomas Francis Meagher. This Society supported the purchase of this building in letters to Tipperary County Council and to Noel Davern, TD, Minister of State, on November, 17th 1997 as follows:- " it has come to our notice that next year is the 150th anniversary of the 1848 Rising at Ballingarry, Co. Tipperary. This event, as you may appreciate, is of European significance as it represented an Irish link with the political thought emerging on the continent during 1848 where many cities and states were gripped by revolutions. As the local authority / Teachta Dala for the Ballingarry area, we would appreciate your advice as to whether the County Council is planning to mark the occasion of the 150th Anniversary of the 1848 Rising and what measures, if any, have been taken to declare the Widow McCormack's House in Ballingarry, the site of the Rising, a building of national historical significance. Possibly facilitating the County Council or the local Parish to acquire and restore the building as monument to an important link in the tradition that stretches from the United Irishmen of 1798 to the Irish Volunteers of 1916 and to those who participated in the Rising like William Smith O'Brien and Thomas Francis Meagher."
