WHAT'S BRATACHA 2013

Bratacha 2013 is a Festival of Flags and Emblems to be held in Dún Laoghaire on May 9-11 2013.

Flags are more than just coloured pieces of cloth with differing designs that flap in the wind. Flags and emblems are symbols of association with a group, whether that group is a nation, a region, an organisation, a family. Throughout history flags have been used to spearhead change or to resist change. Rulers have used flags and emblems as symbols of their territory, and rulers have been toppled by groups rallying to a flag. Flags may be used to convey a sense of celebration or sadness.

In a maritime context, flags are used both for identification and for signalling messages.

Increasingly, as genetic studies progress, our DNA profiles are becoming flags of identity, indicating family origins, race.

A lot of work has been done recently to assemble the music related to battles and wars in Ireland or involving Irish participants. The World Premiere of a concert of this music will be held during the Festival. The main instruments will be warpipes or uileann pipes. The concert will include a narrative describing the events, and appropriate flags will be shown.

ABOUT DÚN LAOGHAIRE

Dún Laoghaire is a seaside town and ferryport about 10km southeast of Dublin city, and is the county town of the county of Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown. The town developed in the 1800s around a massive stone-built harbour of 250 acres which was officially opened in 1823. Many buildings in the town were redeveloped in 1890-1910 and much of the fabric of the Victorian and Edwardian town has been preserved.

Dún Laoghaire, with the shortest ferry crossing to the UK is an excellent start-point or finish-point for your holiday. It has excellent transport links to Dublin City and to Dublin Airport.

All BRATACHA venues are expected to be within 200m of the town centre
